Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you for your continued support as we all work together to keep everyone safe. The Department of Education in conjunction with the Department of Health have issued new guidelines for children who are absent from school. The only reason children should be absent from school is if they are sick. All students who are absent must bring a note explaining their absence on the day they return to school.

Students who are away from school with a fever, headache, runny nose, cough, sore throat or any flu like symptoms cannot return to school without a negative COVID test or medical certificate stating that they are virus free and fit to return to school. Students who return to school without either of these will be sent home until the family can present the documentation to the school. While this may be inconvenient for some families it is one way that we can try to keep everyone safe.

Fathers' Day is fast approaching. Happy Father's Day to all our dads, uncles, grandfathers, brothers and males in our students, lives. Thank you for being there for them and supporting them as they grow. Best wishes for your special day.

What's Happening in English in Stage 2?

Students in Stage 2 have been exploring a variety of quality texts including the text 'Lester and Clyde' by James H. Reece and 'How Frogs Grow' by Brenda Parkes, discussing the different features of fiction and non-fiction texts. Students have engaged with an array of differentiated and engaging activities to develop their reading, comprehension, writing, vocabulary, grammar and speaking and listening skills. All activities have been implemented to specifically target the needs of students that have a language background other than English (EAL/D). Students have worked as a whole class, in small groups as well as independently with the support of their classroom teachers as well as Mrs Tsilimos.







Students created and presented story maps. They chose the key parts of the story and represented them with images and text.










Students listened to the text and visualised what the setting of the story would look like. They illustrated the pond as they imagined it and then labelled their work using nouns and adjectives.







Students learnt about the difference in features between an information text and a fictional text. They created a frog life cycle and wrote sentences that relate to each stage of the life cycle.

Students demonstrated their comprehension of the text 'Lester and Clyde' by completing sequencing activities where they sequenced main events in the story and wrote a retell.
