Due to the ongoing COVID restrictions this year's Opportunity Class Placement Test has been rescheduled to **Wednesday**, **17 November 2021**. It has been agreed by the Minister that the test will be administered as a computerbased test in a process similar to the Check In assessments.

To ensure that students can be placed at the beginning of the 2022 school year students who applied for OC placement will be tested at their own school.

Selective High School 2023

Current Year 5 students who wish to apply for selective High Schools in 2023 can apply online from 19 October 2021 to 17 November 2021.

School as Community Centre News

Lovely to see all the smiling faces of children (and parents) with everyone returning to school this week. Expect it is much quieter at home now!

Thank you to the parents who have called asking about playgroup in the Centre. Unfortunately, due to Department of Education Covid Safe plans for schools, we will not be starting any face to face groups in the Centre probably until next year. Hopefully we will be back with a full week of activities from next year.

Transition to School: Some parents have been asking about this and are concerned because their children will miss the usual sessions which familiarise them with school. If you would like to join the online sessions run by Save the Children on Friday afternoons please let myself or Rojalin know. Children practise some skills such as taking turns and asking for help while parents can have a chance to discuss their concerns. Rojalin's number is 0437 651180.

- Things parents can do to help:
 - 1. Book reading: share a book with your child every day- this helps them to learn new words and sentences and understand other people's experiences.
 - 2. Take time to talk: about everyday things you and they are doing, like cooking, shopping or playing. Introduce new words and explain what they mean. Children need to be able to talk confidently about their experiences and needs at school.
 - 3. Encourage Independence: including going to the toilet without help and washing their hands; getting dressed in the morning including putting on shoes; managing food items themselves like lunchboxes and drink bottles.
 - 4. Learning to draw and write: provide lots of drawing opportunities at home including drawing shapes and learning to recognise their name. Use thick markers or crayons to encourage the correct finger grip.
 - Learning to cut: teach them to hold the scissors correctly and how to stabilise the paper with their other hand. 5. Use old magazines or newspaper to provide plenty of practice to strengthen their fingers. Start with small snips and progress to long straight lines, then squares and circles.

Speech therapy: If you have a young child who is on a waiting list for speech therapy or an assessment please contact Wendi at lakembasacc@gmail.com as there are some online sessions this term in partnership with Sydney University. We are especially interested in hearing from parents with 4 year olds starting school next year who might benefit from some help with their expressive language.

For Pre-schoolers: There are some fabulous early childhood lessons and resources written by the Department of Education Early Childhood staff for parents to do at home if their children are not going to childcare at the moment.
