Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you for your patience over the last two weeks as the school has had to be closed by the Department of Health and Department of Education to allow for cleaning following the reporting of positive COVID 19 cases in the community.

Since students have returned to school we have put in place several strategies to restrict the mixing of students across the school. These include students working Stages, separate recess and lunch times and playgrounds, teachers working with one Stage only instead of across the school and not working in other classrooms such as the Library and Computer Lab.

We understand that you will be worried and concerned about your children attending school. It is very important that everyone continues to ensure that they do not send their children to school if there is the slightest chance that they could be sick. This includes a slight fever or headache and includes any of the symptoms below:

- fever
- cough
- tiredness
- loss of taste or smell
- sore throat
- headache
- aches and pains
- diarrhoea
- a rash on skin, or discolouration of fingers or toes
- red or irritated eyes
- difficulty breathing or shortness of breath.

When emailing the school please make sure that you include your child's name and class in the email.

A COVID Vaccination and Testing hub is expected to be set up in Wiley Park this week. Please take the opportunity to use the facility while it is so close to us.

Staff Update

Overseas Travel

Restrictions on travel have recently eased and families are able to travel. While we understand that families have not been able to see their overseas family for some



time it is important that everyone who travels during school time understands that under the NSW Education Act students should only be absent from school if they are sick. This is marked as justified leave.

Families who are travelling must complete an Application for Extended Leave – Travel which is available from the office. This informs the school about your travel and means that students who do not attend school for an extended period of time without the school's knowledge are not reported as missing students to the Department of Education's Home School Liaison Officer (HSLO). All travel or holidays taken during school time are marked as unjustified leave. This does not mean that the student cannot travel with the family.

When applying for *Extended Leave – Travel* the family must supply their itinerary – return airline tickets. One way airline tickets are not considered evidence of the intention to return to Lakemba Public School.

Afternoon Pick Up

Thank you to everyone for following the directions at pick up time in the afternoon. The directions are designed so that adults and children are not crossing paths. In an effort to keep everyone as safe as possible we ask everyone to wear a mask.

Check in Assessments for Years 3, 4, 5, 6

Over the next few weeks students in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 are participating in reading and numeracy Check In assessments. The Check In Assessments are an initiative of the Department of the Education to support schools to assess and monitor student learning. The assessments will supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing and to assist teachers tailor teaching and learning. Students with a disability will receive the same level of support during the assessment as they would normally receive in their classroom.

2021 Tell Them From Me Student Survey

Last week parents and carers of students in Years 4, 5 and 6 would have received a note about their child taking part in the Tell Them From Me Survey. The survey provides us with valuable feedback on what our students think about school life and how engaged they are with school. Students do not have to answer all questions and can stop the survey if they do not want to complete it. Students who returned the nonparticipation note will not complete the survey.

2021 Tell Them From Me Parent Survey

This Term, our school will be participating in the Partners in Learning parent survey, another part of the Tell Them From Me suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement. The survey asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement. This survey will help our school understand parents and carers perspectives on their child's experience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements. The survey is conducted entirely online on smartphones, iPads, tablets, laptops or computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. The school is is not able to see individual parent responses. Due to the ongoing COVID restrictions this year's Opportunity Class Placement Test has been rescheduled to **Wednesday**, **17 November 2021**. It has been agreed by the Minister that the test will be administered as a computer-based test in a process similar to the Check In assessments.

To ensure that students can be placed at the beginning of the 2022 school year students who applied for OC placement will be tested at their own school.

Selective High School 2023

Current Year 5 students who wish to apply for selective High Schools in 2023 can apply online from 19 October 2021 to 17 November 2021.
