High School 2022

Local High Schools are organising orientation times for students who will be attending their school in 2022. It is important that your child attends these sessions so please monitor your emails and mail to ensure that you don't miss your child's High School orientation.

There are many ways in which parents can support their child to make a smooth transition to High School. Some of these include:

- speaking enthusiastically about the change of school and possibly friends that they are about to experience.
- making sure that your child understands and has practised how they will travel to and from their High School.
- organising their uniform and supplies well before their first day of High School.
- discussing emergency and safety routines such as what to do if they miss the train or bus, are late to school, can't understand their timetable and get lost in the school.

All of these things can cause your soon to be High School child to be anxious or worried. Discussing these things with them can help them to feel less anxious.

Unfortunately, there are some families who have not enrolled their Year 6 child in a High School for next year. It is now the responsibility of parents to contact High Schools to arrange enrolment. Please be aware that all schools are bound by their enrolment policy that outlines the procedure for out of area enrolments. Most High Schools have already filled their out of area enrolment quotas.

Check in Assessments for Years 3, 4, 5, 6

Over the next few weeks students in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 are participating in reading and numeracy Check In assessments. The Check In Assessments are an initiative of the Department of the Education to support schools to assess and monitor student learning. The assessments will supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing and to assist teachers tailor teaching and learning. Students with a disability will receive the same level of support during the assessment as they would normally receive in their classroom.

Kindergarten 2022

Children who turn 5 before 1st August 2022 are eligible to begin school next year. Parents and carers should complete the application online through the link on the school website.

Families who have enrolled online have been sent information about a school tour and interview that is organised for 29 November to 3 December.

Overseas Travel

Restrictions on travel have recently eased and families are able to travel. While we understand that families have not been able to see their overseas family for some time it is important that everyone who travels during school time understands that under the NSW Education Act students should only be absent from school if they are sick. This is marked as justified leave.

Families who are travelling must complete an Application for Extended Leave – Travel which is available from the office. This informs the school about your travel and means that students who do not attend school for an extended period of time without the school's knowledge are not reported as missing students to the Department of Education's Home School Liaison Officer (HSLO). All travel or holidays taken during school time are marked as unjustified leave. This does not mean that the student cannot travel with the family.



When applying for Extended Leave – Travel the family must supply their itinerary – return airline tickets. One way airline tickets are not considered evidence of the intention to return to Lakemba Public School.


