COVID Update

Please be aware that there have been cases of COVID reported in our community. It is important that we all continue to take precautions to keep ourselves safe and healthy. This includes:

Independence

All children need to develop their independence. This means that they are able to rely on themselves, and not their parents, carers, or other adults, to know what they want, where they need to be, and do things for them. A good example of this is children being able to dress themselves without any help whatsoever from a parent or going to the bathroom on their own without assistance. By the time children come to school they should be able to do both of these things.

Independence is important because it:

- 1. Promotes confidence and self-esteem as well as motivation and perseverance in school and life.
- 2. Fosters self-reliance, allowing children to feel they have control over their life.
- 3. Gives children a sense of importance and <u>belonging</u> which is essential for building social relationships and for contributing to the world.
- 4. Develops children's levels of self-awareness and sensitivity towards others which teaches them to help those around them.
- 5. Teaches children self-motivation as they have the freedom to find their own reasons to achieve.
- 6. Provides children with the belief that they are competent and capable of taking care of themselves which makes them resilient to external challenges.
- 7. Allows children to become <u>good decision-makers</u> as they have the freedom to consider various options before choosing the one they feel is best.
- 8. Develops other vital qualities such as patience, concentration, self-help, cooperation, self-discipline and self-trust.
- 9. Gives children the freedom to experience life fully and learn its many important lessons.
- 10. Makes children happy and healthy as they feel a great sense of achievement and success as a direct result of their own actions.

While being independent is extremely important it is also very important that children know how and when to ask for help if they need it.

Presentation Day

We are planning to hold Presentation Day at school on Thursday 8th December. The celebration of student achievement will be held in two sections – Early Stage 1 and Stage 1 and then Stage 2 and Stage 3.

Not every child will be recognised with an award on this day. On this day a small number of children from each class will receive an award. Even though your child may not receive an award on the day it is important that you recognise their achievement. This can be as simple as discussing their report with them and assuring them that you are proud that they have done their best.







Merit Awards, Special Awards and Pennants

The last day for trading awards this year will be Wednesday 30th November.

No awards will be traded after this day. Students will have to keep them safe and trade them next year.
