#### COVID

Please remember that all positive cases of COVID must be reported to the school as well as on the NSW Service App. Recent rule changes mean that students who are close contacts can attend school as long as they test every morning and follow COVID Safe procedures while on site – physical distancing, washing hands and sanitising regularly.

#### Opportunity Classes 2023 – Year 4 Students 2022

Opportunity classes cater for academically gifted and high potential students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. Successful students will usually have to leave their current school to enrol in a school with an opportunity class for Years 5 and 6.

Applications for opportunity class placement are considered mainly on the combined results of the Opportunity Class Placement Test and school assessments. Students who wish to be considered for opportunity class placement will sit the Opportunity Class Placement Test on Thursday 28 July 2022.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 5 opportunity class entry in 2023, you need to apply between Tuesday 26 April 2022 and Friday 13 May 2022. #### Tell Them From Me

This term, our school is taking part in the *Tell Them From* Me student survey. The survey will provide us with valuable feedback on what our students in Years 4, 5 and 6 think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them.

Schools in Australia and around the world have used the *Tell Them From Me* survey to help them improve. The survey is completed online and is run by an independent research company, The Learning Bar which specialises in school-based surveys.

Staff in schools will **not** be able to identify individual students from their responses. To ensure confidentiality, participating students will receive a unique username and password. Where fewer than five students respond to a question, the results will be suppressed. The survey typically takes 30 minutes or less to complete and will be administered by the school during normal school hours. Once the surveys are completed by students, reports are prepared and in most cases are available to schools within three business days.

This survey will help our school better understand how to improve student wellbeing and engagement. It will help the school identify what works to improve student outcomes.

Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary. Your child will not take part if either you or your child do not wish. If, during the survey, your child is uncomfortable, he/she can choose to stop the survey at any time. Most questions in the survey can be skipped.

You will receive a note next week about the survey. If you do not wish your child to take part you will need to sign the note and return it to your child's teacher.
