Dear Parents and Carers,

We are over halfway through Term 3. The weather is becoming warmer and the days are getting longer.

Over the last two weeks we have enjoyed being able to welcome parents on site for special events such as Student Leader Induction Assembly, Education Week and NAIDOC Week. We thank everyone who comes on site for making sure that they are feeling well and leaving the school grounds promptly when the event has concluded.

Being At School ALL Day

The Department of Education expects that all students are at school by the time the bell rings at the beginning of the day and stay at school until the bell rings at the end of the day. At Lakemba Public School this means being at school from 9am to 3pm.

All students should be seated in their class line when the bell goes at 9am and not leave until the bell goes at 3pm in the afternoon.

Unfortunately many families organise appointments for their children during the day. This means that students miss valuable learning time. Late arrival and early departure also disrupts the learning of other students, the work of the teacher and work of the office who have to stop their work to attend to the student and parents.

We understand that sometimes making appointments during school time is unavoidable as far as possible appointments should be made before or after school. All leave for appointments is recorded as 'unjustified' unless they are accompanied by a medical certificate. This affects your child's percentage of attendance.

Head Lice

We have had a number of cases of head lice reported across the school. Head lice are tiny wingless insects. They live among human hairs and feed on blood from the scalp.

Head lice are a common problem, especially for kids. They spread easily from person to person, and sometimes are hard to get rid of. Their bites can make a child's scalp itchy and irritated causing them to scratch.

Head lice are annoying, but they are not dangerous and they don't spread disease. They are not a sign of poor hygiene. They often prefer clean shiny hair.

Parents should check their child's hair regularly. Students who do have head lice cannot be at school until their hair has been treated. Treatments can be purchased at the chemist or in some supermarkets.

The affected student's bed linen, hair brushes and hair ties should also be treated.



Fathers Day isn't too far away. We will be having a Father's Day Stall so that your child can purchase something special for Dad or the male role model in your family on his special day.

You will have received a note asking for donations of gifts for dads. It would be fantastic if everyone could donate one gift.

Crossing the Road

When crossing the road at the pedestrian crossing on Alice Street South, please wait on the footpath until the Crossing Supervisor has reached the middle of the road and indicates that you can cross the road. This is to keep you safe in case there is a car that does not slow and stop for pedestrians.

Voluntary School Contribution

Thank you to the families who have made their voluntary contribution to our school. Every year we ask families to make a small contribution to assist us to provide resources for your children. As we have done for the last three years we are asking parents to contribute:

- \$35 per student or
- \$70 per family.

Your contribution will be used to purchase resources to enable your children to have access to items to help them

in their learning. This year we will use the contributions to increase our Take Home and Guided Reading resources.

Swimming School

Students in Year 2 through to Year 6 are eligible to take part in the Swimming School in Term 4. The



Swimming School is a ten day program at Roselands Aquatic Centre. Students' confidence and skill in the water will be assessed before they are placed in groups that will develop their ability to be safe and comfortable in the water. More able students will be taught to swim. Students who cannot confidently swim 25m are encouraged to attend.

Students will be bused to and from the pool each day. We do not know the exact cost of the program but it will be approximately \$100. We are letting you know now about the program early so that families who want their children to take part have time to budget for the cost.

A note will be sent home when the final details have been organised.

Overseas Travel

Many families at Lakemba Public School take their children out of school and travel overseas for long periods of time during the year. As far as possible all travel should be arranged during school holidays and not during school time. Australian law states that students must



attend school every day unless they are sick.

Families wanting to travel overseas must apply for Extended Leave Travel BEFORE they travel and provide their travel itinerary. Please be aware that all leave taken to travel is recorded as unjustified as per Department of Education guidelines. Thank you to the many parents who do this. 




