School as Community Centre News



Playgroup sessions on Mondays and Fridays are designed to integrate key elements of Early Learning through hands-on activities, encouraging exploration, sensory experiences, and fostering creativity in both indoor and outdoor environments. Each week, a comprehensive program embracing all facets of Early Learning Years is presented to support children and their families. The Lakemba Community Centre is privileged to have Koorana Early Childhood teachers leading our Playgroups.

The Community Services Certificate 4 Course, scheduled for Tuesdays, is approaching its Orientation/Induction Day on the 5th of March, commencing at 9:30 am. While current participants have completed their enrolment, if you are still interested, please reach out to the Community Centre facilitator directly for further information.

The Rohingya Group engages in weekly Yoga sessions on Wednesdays, promoting the connection of body, breath, and mind. Following the yoga sessions, the 'Circle of Security' course is offered, aiming to enhance not only healthy relationships between parents and children but also to provide lifelong benefits for the child.

Starting on the 7th of March, The Sydney University is resuming its programs over a 9-week period. The Language Learners program is tailored for children aged 4-5 years, empowering their lifelong learning journey through targeted communication and literacy activities. Simultaneously, the Toddler Talk program for children aged 2-3 years focuses on enhancing communication and play skills through interactive language and play activities. These programs require enrolment for your child.
